Key Advocacy Efforts and Achievements

Mecklenburg County Park & Recreation Investments

Successfully secured increased funding for Mecklenburg County Park and Recreation in both the county's annual operating budget and capital budget. By collecting 1350 signatures on this petition, meeting with county commissioners, helping community members speak at budget hearings, and partnering with other organizations, we helped achieve \$50 million to acquire land for future parks, greenways, and nature preserves, an additional \$3 million for improvements to existing parks and greenways, and sufficient funding for 15 new Park and Rec staff positions. We also successfully secured the inclusion of two critical Irwin Creek Greenway segments, passed over in the previous capital budget, that will improve greenway access, mobility choices, and community connectivity for West Charlotte neighborhoods.



City of Charlotte Transportation Investments

Played a pivotal role in securing \$65 million in funding for sidewalks, Strategic Investment Areas, Corridors of Opportunity, and transportation improvements in the city's capital budget. This funding was cut from the budget a week before the final vote. Thanks to the residents who joined us and urged city council members to restore these funds, they were included in the approved budget and those who spoke up were credited for this change. In addition, we helped secure \$8 million to expand the bike network, \$50 million for sidewalks, and \$20 million over the next two years for measures that will help reduce fatalities and serious injuries through the City's Vision Zero program.

One Cent for Mobility

Successfully advocated for Charlotte City Council members to approve the **purchase of railroad tracks** from Norfolk Southern to build the Red Line and support state legislation for a **one-cent county-wide sales tax** to expand and improve bus and rail transit and safer streets for walking and biking. This legislation will be considered by state lawmakers in early 2025 and we will continue our advocacy for it.

Compact Development

Successfully advocated for Charlotte City Council to adopt zoning changes to **boost housing supply** and **restore specific standards for walkability and good urban design** by updating the Conservation Residential Development subdivision option of the Unified Development Ordinance.

Public Accessibility

Successfully advocated for changes to a rezoning petition involving the Panthers' new practice facility, ensuring that an existing public path is improved in accordance with the city's plans for this segment of the Uptown bicycle network as part of construction. This will enhance public access and connectivity for walking and biking.

Vision Zero

Advocated to maintain Charlotte's commitment to **eliminating traffic fatalities** through the Vision Zero program and opposed funding cuts to pedestrian safety initiatives.



Community Education, Outreach, and Events

Sustain Charlotte Awards

Hosted a sold-out event celebrating the sustainability achievements of more than 70 nominees in eight categories. This event serves as a major annual fundraiser to support and highlight the efforts of individuals, businesses, government agencies, and nonprofits leading the way toward a sustainable community.

10th Annual Biketoberfest

Celebrated a decade of promoting sustainable transportation through our annual Biketoberfest event, inspiring 750 people to explore Charlotte by bike or foot and discover new businesses, parks, and greenways while raising funds to support our work. As a result of the event, 60% of participants said they were more likely to walk or bike for transportation.

Sustain Charlotte Socials

Hosted five educational events featuring expert speakers and advocacy opportunities for attendees. Topics included equity and smart growth, park and recreation advocacy, building our bicycle network, the future of Charlotte's tree canopy, and building a better bus network.

Impact 704 Academy

Hosted a three-part educational series to educate, inspire, and equip attendees to better advocate for responsible growth and transportation choices.

Community Outreach and Education

Gave **27 presentations** and provided information at 44 community events to educate the public about sustainability. Published 61 articles. appeared 77 times in media coverage, and sent 52 educational newsletters providing opportunities for engagement.

Sustain Charlotte Ambassador Program

Trained **213 community members** to represent Sustain Charlotte's vision and expand our reach through events and activities.


Launched a new digital platform with improved accessibility and usability for sustainabilityrelated resources, upcoming events, and advocacy initiatives.

Partnerships and Collaborations

Voter Guide

Collaborated with the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Climate Leaders coalition to research and release a local voter guide to inform Mecklenburg County voters on where the candidates for the county commission stand on a range of issues, including climate action, mobility, and green space.

World Day of Remembrance

Spoke at the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims event hosted by the City of Charlotte, honoring those killed due to traffic violence and highlighting the need to design our streets for safety rather than speed to prevent future deaths and serious injuries.

Around the Crown 10K

Participated in a sustainability panel and recruited volunteers to reduce landfill waste at race-related events as a proud beneficiary of this popular annual race that emphasizes supporting sustainability efforts and highlighting the diversity and history of Charlotte's neighborhoods.

May Days of Biking Challenge

Encouraged community participation in bikerelated activities as part of the #BikeCharlotte 2024 event featuring 27 days of cycling events and promotions. We promoted greenways, bike routes and group rides.

Bike Lane Support

Sponsored the People-Powered Bike Lane Sweeper, emphasizing the need for building and maintaining safe bike lanes and supporting access to reliable cycling infrastructure across the city.

Clean Air Games

Organized a challenge event in partnership with Mecklenburg County Air Quality and Charlotte Area Transportation System to encourage vehicle tripreduction activities like biking and walking.







Additional Climate and Transportation Advocacy

Bicycle Network Campaign

Continued advocacy to expand Charlotte's bicycle infrastructure, pushing for the completion of 100+ miles of bike lanes by 2040.

Transit Equity Day

Expressed appreciation for bus drivers, encouraged residents to do the same, and highlighted what is needed to create equitable, efficient public transit on Transit Equity Day — a day dedicated to celebrating the legacy of Rosa Parks and advocating for equitable access to public transportation for all people.

Rise and Ride Events

Hosted three experiential CATS bus ride events, attended by elected officials and residents, aimed at educating the public to navigate the Charlotte bus system to increase regular usage.



National Advocacy

Joined national advocacy efforts to ensure transit projects and funding sources align with the Reconnecting Communities initiative, promoting equitable mobility and development.

Day Without Driving

Organized Day Without Driving to encourage elected officials and residents who drive to better understand the needs of people who don't drive, including one-third of residents in Mecklenburg County.

Solar Energy Support

Successfully advocated for Charlotte City Council to approve a contract for the construction of the South Davidson Solar Project to provide renewable energy to the city. This solar farm will provide the greenhouse gas reduction benefit equivalent to taking about 24,000 cars off the road per year and is expected to begin construction in the fall of 2025.

Climate Week Workshop

Partnered with CleanAIRE NC, Self-Help Credit Union, and Southern Alliance for Clean Energy to present a virtual climate action workshop on how transportation choices, like switching to electric vehicles or using sustainable transport, can significantly reduce carbon footprints.

Nominated for the Charlotte Observer's Charlotte's Best Award in the Best Nonprofit category, highlighting the impact of our staff, board members, volunteers, and donors in advancing sustainability across the Charlotte region.

Power 100 Innovator
